

Bodies of 5 children found at German apartment

BERLIN: Five children were found dead at an apartment in a western German city Thursday, and their mother is suspected of killing them, authorities said.

US cops suffocate black man to death



New York officers covered Daniel Prude's head with 'spit hood' & held him to the ground before he stopped breathing

Protests have erupted in upstate New York after a newly surfaced video revealed how a 41-year-old handcuffed black man died of asphyxiation in March after a group of police officers put a hood over his head, then pressed his face into the ground until he stopped breathing, reports the Daily Mail.

Daniel Prude died March 30 after he was taken off life support, seven days after the encounter with police in Rochester.

His death received no public attention until Wednesday, when his family held a news conference and released police body camera videos and written reports they obtained through a public records request.

"I placed a phone call for my brother to get help. Not for my brother to get lynched," Prude's brother, Joe Prude, said at a news conference.

"How did you see him and not directly say? The man is defenseless, buck naked on the ground. He's cuffed up already. Come on. How many more brothers gotta die for society to understand that this needs to stop?" The videos show Prude, who had taken off his clothes, complying when police ask him to get on the ground and put his hands behind his back.

Prude is agitated and shouting as he sits on the pavement in handcuffs for a few moments as a light snow falls. "Give me your gun, I need it," he shouts.

Then, they put a white 'spit

hood' over his head, a device intended to protect officers from a detainee's saliva. At the time, New York was in the early days of the coronavirus pandemic.

Prude demands they remove it. Then the officers slam Prude's head into the street. One officer, who is white, holds his head down against the pavement with both hands, saying "calm down" and "stop spitting." Another officer places a knee on his back.

"Trying to kill me!" Prude says, his voice becoming muffled and anguished under the hood.

"OK, stop. I need it. I need it," the prone man begs before his shouts turn to whimpers and grunts.

The officers appear to become concerned after he stops moving, falls silent and they notice water

coming out of Prude's mouth. "My man. You puking?" one says.

One officer notes that he's been out, naked, in the street for some time. Another remarks, "He feels pretty cold." His head had been held down by an officer for just over two minutes, the video shows.

Prude was from Chicago and had just arrived in Rochester for a visit with his brother. He was kicked off the train before it got to Rochester, in Depew, "due to his unruly behavior," according to an internal affairs investigator's report.

Rochester police officers took Prude into custody for a mental health evaluation around 7 pm on March 22 for suicidal thoughts — about eight hours before the encounter that led to his death.

But his brother said he was only at the hospital for a few hours, according to the reports.

Trump, Biden's quibbles go on

As thunderstorms threatened, President Donald Trump sped through a V-J Day speech on Wednesday, trumpeting American strength and managing to squeeze in a swipe at Democratic rival Joe Biden.

Trump stood before an iconic World War II-era battleship to declare the port city of Wilmington, North Carolina, a World War II "Heritage City." He pointed to a bolt of lightning and said it was God saluting the event.

He honored war veterans, including 97-year-old Hershel "Woody" Williams, the sole surviving Marine from the war to receive the Medal of Honour. The West Virginia native fought in the Battle of Iwo Jima in the Pacific. "He's 100 percent sharp," Trump said of Williams.

"I know a 78-year-old who's not so sharp," Trump added, a clear allusion to Biden.

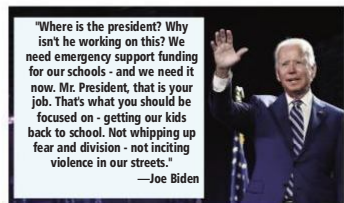
White House press secretary Kayleigh McEnany had insisted earlier this week that there was no "political purpose" to Trump's visit to North Carolina.

But when the president landed in Wilmington, Trump lost no time in criticizing Biden.

Meanwhile, Joe Biden is calling the struggle to reopen US schools amid the coronavirus a "national emergency" and accusing President Donald Trump of turning his back to stoke passions around a World War II American city.

The Democratic presidential nominee's broadside came a day ahead of his own trip to Kenosha, Wisconsin, where Biden said he wants to help "heal" a city reeling from another police shooting of a Black man.

Biden assailed Trump for his vilifying of protesters as well as his handling of the pandemic that has killed nearly 190,000 Americans and crippled the national economy, leaving millions out of work, schools straining to deal with students in classrooms or at home and parents struggling to keep up.

Japan: Stormy sea gulps livestock ship

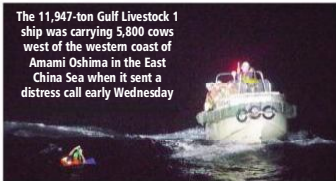

Japanese rescuers were searching Thursday for a livestock ship with 42 crew members on board that a survivor said sank during rough weather a day earlier off a southern Japanese island, the coast guard said.

The Filipino crew member was rescued late Wednesday after Japanese navy P-3C surveillance aircraft spotted him wearing a life vest and waving white bobbing in the water.

The man, who is in good health, told rescuers the ship capsized before sinking, said spokesman Yuichiro Higashi at the Japanese coast guard's regional headquarters conducting the search.

The 11,947-ton Gulf Livestock 1 ship was carrying



5,800 cows west of the western coast of Amami Oshima in the East China Sea when it sent a distress call early Wednesday.

The ship's other crew include 38 from the Philippines, two from New Zealand and another two from Australia.

The ship, owned by Gulf Navigation Holding based in the United Arab Emirates, left the port of Nephiri in northeastern New Zealand in mid-August and was on its way to the port of Tangshan on China's eastern coast.

Oz police arrest pregnant mother

A pregnant woman said on Thursday she didn't know she had broken any law when she was handcuffed by police in front of her children in her Australian home and led away in pyjamas for allegedly inciting activists to demonstrate against pandemic lockdown.

Zoe Buhler's partner helped her livestream the arrest on Wednesday at her home where she lives with two children, aged 3 and 4, in the Victoria state city of Ballarat.

The video has been viewed millions of times. The 28-year-old has since been charged with using so-

cial media platforms to incite others to break pandemic restrictions by attending weekend rallies.

"The police could have given me a phone call and said, 'Look, you need to take down your event or you could be charged with a crime,' and I would have done that," she told reporters. "It could have been as simple as that. You know, I'm not someone that you know ever commit a crime," she added.

Victoria Police Assistant Commissioner Luke Cornelius described it as "entirely arresting." "The optics of arresting someone who is pregnant are terrible," Cornelius said.

US refuses to pay remaining dues to WHO

The Trump administration has said it won't pay more than USD 60 million in dues it owes to the World Health Organization and will use the money instead to pay down other contributions to the United Nations.

The announcement on Wednesday came just a day after the White House announced the US would not participate in a WHO-run project to develop and distribute a COVID-19 vaccine.

The decision to withhold roughly USD 62 million in outstanding 2020 dues to the WHO is part of President Donald Trump's decision to withdraw from the organization over its handling of the coronavirus pandemic.

Meet the awesome threesome of B'desh

When Bangladeshi authorities prepared to enforce a nationwide lockdown in late March, three friends fretted: How would rickshaw drivers, factory workers and other working poor people survive? With only 20,000 takas (USD 236) in hand, their challenge was to channel resources from the generous to the desperate. They started making appeals for money.

The first response came from Bangladeshi cricketer star Shakib Al Hasan who donated 2 million takas (USD 24,000). With that, they began distributing food packs in the impoverished neighbourhoods in Dhaka.

Eventually, they succeeded in bringing about 120 organisations and business houses under one umbrella for their aid campaign, Mission Save Bangladesh. Their work has since expanded to helping families fighting cancer and to arranging supplies of masks and sanitiser.
